  - Historic and Interpretive panels




### The Look

- Consistent sign placement





# Sign Types and Rules



#### Totem

- Trailheads
- Multi-directional intersections



### Large Post

- Used where two trails branch
- Adopt a trails recognition signs
- Inform of trail links or other info
- Larger warnings not to wander off trail (red background with white lettering)

### Small Post


- Directional information
- Feature indicator- i.e. "River Access"
- Mileage markers
- Visual link or "sight to sight" signage along trail
- Ghost trails (red background with white "X")

# Sign Types and Rules

#### Kiosk



- Locate at major trail heads with parking
- Significant signage Trail map, informational bulletin, trail etiquette, trail events, etc.
- Gateway, Shelter and/or rest bench



### Interpretive Signage

- Significant points of interest
- Landmarks or Historical sites
- Scientific features of area





# **Funding**

- Potential funding sources include:
  - City Budget
  - Local business/organizations partnerships & donations
  - Adopt-a-Trail donors
  - Funds from trail events
  - Federal and local grants:
    - RAMP
    - Recreational Trails Program (RTP) grants
    - Others

# Implementation

- Best if observed as a "city standard" rather than an adopted ordinance
- Materials can be sourced from local producers (support local economy first!)
- Installation can be performed by:
  - Parks & Recreation employees
  - Boy Scouts
  - Other volunteer groups with proper supervision

## Customized Features

Not all features along the trail have to be uniform, individual jurisdictions may still choose to add customized features such as:

- Benches
- Garbage cans
- Mutt mitt stations
- Pathway lighting
- o Etc.
