

WEBER COUNTY ATTORNEY'S OFFICE POLICY VICTIM'S RIGHTS COMPLAINTS

WHEREAS, the Weber County Attorney's Office interacts with crime victims on a regular basis and strives to treat them with respect and dignity; and

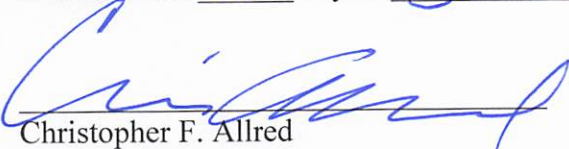
WHEREAS, state law grants certain rights to crime victims, including the rights that are listed in Utah Code Ann. § 77-37-3 (as of April 2026) and summarized on the website of the Utah Office for Victims of Crime, available at <https://crimevictim.utah.gov/victim-rights/>; and

WHEREAS, state law requires a criminal justice agency to "establish a policy for addressing a complaint alleging a violation of a victim's right" (Utah Code Ann. § 63M-7-1003);

NOW THEREFORE, the Weber County Attorney's Office establishes the following policy:

1. Complaints about violations of victims' rights must be in writing and must be sent to victimrights@co.weber.ut.us.
2. Each complaint must contain the following information:
 - a. The name and contact information of the victim;
 - b. Sufficient information to identify the case;
 - c. The right that the victim feels was violated;
 - d. A detailed description of how the victim feels the right was violated; and
 - e. The identity, if known, of the individual(s) involved in the described violation of the right.
3. After a complaint is received, it will be sent to the supervisor(s) of the individual(s) involved in the described violation.
4. The supervisor(s) of the involved individual(s) will review the complaint, review the identified case materials, and consult with the involved individual(s). They may also take other steps, as appropriate, in their investigation. After completing their investigation, they will make written findings as to whether or not the victim's rights were violated.
5. The victim will be informed of the findings and any options for further review.
6. Complaint forms, written findings, and all related documents will be handled in accordance with applicable state laws and local ordinances governing public records access and management.
7. Information about filing a complaint shall be added to the Weber County Attorney's Victim Witness website as soon as possible. It shall include a link to this policy and a link to any form that may be created to assist in the filing of a complaint.
