Summary:

Trails Foundation of Northern Utah (TFNU) is requesting a donation of "Prop 1 funds" in the amount of \$31,299.76 for asphalt and crack seal repairs on the Pineview Loop Trail, and a right-of-way impact analysis for a future trail from Liberty Park to North Fork Park.

- The asphalt surface and crack seal repairs are on the pathway sections adjacent to Hwy 158 and 2200 N north and east of the "Y" intersection, and on 1900 N at approximately 6500 E. The total cost for the repairs is \$21,609.76.
- The right-of-way impact analysis for a future trail from Liberty Park to North Fork Park will include a summary of all adjacent properties and provide quantities for each type of recommended right-of-way purchase (acquisition, easement, etc.). The total cost for this analysis is \$9,690.

The requested donation will come from the County option sales and use tax for highways and public transit, also known as "Prop 1 funds." Weber County is authorized to use Prop 1 funds for specific transportation-related purposes described in state law, including "the development, construction, maintenance, or operation of" certain thoroughfares and trails.

On February 4, 2020, the County Commission approved a memorandum of understanding (MOU) with TFNU (under its former business name, Weber Pathways) for all future Prop 1 Fund donations. This MOU eliminates the need for a separate agreement with each donation request. TFNU will apply to the County for future Prop 1 Fund donations and reference this MOU as the basis for compliance and approval.

Weber County allocated \$200,000 of the 2021 Prop 1 fund budget for pathway maintenance. This request will leave the remaining balance at **\$141,220.24**. The following donation has already been approved:

July 2021: **\$27,480** donation for sign adaptors, asphalt repair, and a concept report for a future trail from Liberty Park to North Fork Park



RE: Eden Trail - Liberty Park to 5900 North - Right of Way Identification

Dear Alan:

Project Engineering Consultants, Ltd. (PEC) is pleased to submit a scope and fee to evaluate and prepare a right-of-way impact analysis for a new trail in Eden, Utah that extends from 4100 North (Liberty Park) to 5900 North, approximately 2.75 miles. The new trail design will follow the preferred alignment as identified in the concept feasibility study completed prior.

SCOPE OF WORK

Preliminary Design & ROW Identification

PEC will layout the trail design per the concept report previously prepared, using the preferred alternative. PEC will utilize database GIS and aerial imagery information for the preliminary design & right-of-way impact analysis. The trail will be designed with enough detail to identify rough order of magnitude right-of-way impacts. PEC will develop a right-of-way summary of all adjacent properties along the proposed trail and provide quantities for each type of recommended right-of-way purchase required, i.e., property acquisition, easement.

Deliverables:

- 1. Scroll plot of trail layout
- 2. Right of Way summary

Proposal Clarifications

The following represent clarifications to the PEC proposal:

- Trail design is based on AASHTO standards
- Design will be developed using AutoCAD 2021
- PEC has assumed 20 parcels where acquisition documents would be required

Proposal Exclusions

The following items are either not specifically identified in the Scope of Services section or are to be excluded from PEC's Scope of Services:

- a. Agency Fees and Permits (Impact Fees, Application, and Review Fees, etc.)
- b. Legal Documents, Title Reports, and Filing Fees
- c. Property or Right-of-Way acquisition and negotiation
- d. Gaps/Overlaps and/or Boundary Resolutions
- e. Trail alignment is assumed to be fixed from the feasibility study already performed, additional alignment alternative analysis is not included

- f. No underground drainage is not expected and has not been included in the cost
- g. Utility Design Utility coordination with 3rd parties is expected but utility relocation design if needed will be provided by utility company.
- h. Off-site improvements including Drainage, Roadway, Grading, Utilities, etc.
- i. Traffic Impact Study (TIS) and Report
- i. Retaining wall layout and design services
- k. Landscape and irrigation design services
- I. Bridge design is assumed to be provided by manufacture, PEC will provide design for abutments
- m. Public meetings including one-on-one meetings with property owners and open house meetings.
- n. Extraordinary requirements placed on the project by governing agencies
- o. Construction Staking
- p. Construction administration/ construction management (CA/CM), material testing, and special inspections

The project budget for the scope as outlined above is a lump sum of \$9,690.00. If additional meetings, analysis, design, or work that is outside this scope become necessary, at the client's written direction the work will be performed on a time and expenses basis based on our current fee schedule. This includes additional negotiations and all other procedures not specifically outlined within this scope as requested by the client.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN WEBER PATHWAYS AND WEBER COUNTY

- 1. BACKGROUND: Weber County receives sales tax funds collected under Section 59-12-2219 of the Utah Code, which is known as the "county option sales and use tax for highways and public transit." The funds are sometimes referred to as "Prop 1 funds," because the ballot proposition that resulted in the enactment of the tax in Weber County was known as Proposition 1. Therefore, this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) will use the term "Prop 1 funds" to describe the funds. The County is authorized to use Prop 1 funds for specific transportation-related purposes described in state law, including "the development, construction, maintenance, or operation of" certain thoroughfares and trails. Weber Pathways has asked to use Prop 1 funds for specific trail projects and desires to have future access to the funds for other trail projects.
- PURPOSE: The purpose of this MOU is to guarantee that Weber Pathways, dba Trails Foundation of Northern Utah (TFNU), will use Prop 1 funds in accordance with applicable County and State laws, ordinances, and policies, without requiring a separate contract for each donation of funds. The County Commission finds that these donations will contribute to the safety, health, comfort, and convenience of county residents.
- 3. **SCOPE:** This MOU for the donation and use of Prop 1 funds is made between Weber Pathways and Weber County.
- 4. UNDERSTANDING, AGREEMENTS, AND SUPPORT REQUIREMENTS:
 - A. Weber Pathways is a nonprofit 501(c)(3) organization with a mission to "plan, promote, construct, and protect a network of public pathways, trails, and related open spaces for non-motorized users throughout the greater Weber County area."
 - B. Weber County intends to donate Prop 1 funds to Weber Pathways for the purpose of planning and building eligible pathways and trails in unincorporated Weber County.
 - C. To receive donations of Prop 1 funds, Weber Pathways must apply to the County, specifying which projects the Prop 1 funds will be used for. If Weber Pathways wants to use donated Prop 1 funds for projects not included in the original application, it must file a new application seeking authorization to use the funds for other projects.
 - D. Weber Pathways will only use Weber County's Prop 1 fund donations for corridor preservation, engineering, environmental review, surveying, permitting, construction, project management, and any other project-specific tasks necessary to complete approved projects.
 - E. Weber Pathways will comply with all applicable County and State laws, ordinances, and policies.
 - F. Weber Pathways will account for the expenditure of Prop 1 funds and will provide updates to Weber County upon request.

- G. Weber Pathways will indemnify and hold harmless the County, its officers, agents, and employees from and against any claims or suits that arise as a result of Prop 1 fund donations, including improper use of Prop 1 funds.
- 5. **EFFECTIVE DATE:** This MOU is effective upon signature by both parties and will remain in effect until modified, replaced, or terminated by agreement of the parties.
- 6. **MODIFICATION:** Modification of this agreement requires written notification and approval by both parties 30 days in advance.
- 7. **GOVERNING LAW**: The laws of the State of Utah shall govern the validity, construction, enforcement, and interpretation of this agreement.
- 8. **ENTIRE AGREEMENT**: This agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties hereto with respect to the subject matter hereof, and no other statement, whether written or oral, shall be deemed a part of this agreement unless specifically incorporated herein by reference.
- 9. **SIGNATURES:** In witness whereof the undersigned have affixed their respective signatures hereto on the dates indicated below.
