#### **Summary:**

Trails Foundation of Northern Utah (TFNU) is requesting a \$27,480 donation of "Prop 1 funds" for sign adaptors, asphalt repair, and a concept report for a future trail from Liberty Park to North Fork Park.

- The sign adaptors are for previously purchased LED crosswalk lights that have not yet been installed. The adaptors will make the signs compliant with UDOT requirements. The total cost for the adaptors is \$1,484.60, of which \$1,070 is being requested.
- The asphalt repairs will take place on a five mile section of the Pineview Loop Pathway. The repairs will be done by treating the existing asphalt surface with a high-density emulsion-based polymer material. The total cost for the repairs is \$47,297, of which \$22,330 is being requested.
- The concept report for a future trail from Liberty Park to North Fork Park will include basic engineering and cost estimates from Project Engineering Consultants (PEC). The total cost and request for this concept report is \$4,080.

The requested donation will come from the County option sales and use tax for highways and public transit, also known as "Prop 1 funds." Weber County is authorized to use Prop 1 funds for specific transportation-related purposes described in state law, including "the development, construction, maintenance, or operation of" certain thoroughfares and trails.

On February 4, 2020, the County Commission approved a memorandum of understanding (MOU) with TFNU (under its former business name, Weber Pathways) for all future Prop 1 Fund donations. This MOU eliminates the need for a separate agreement with each donation request. TFNU will apply to the County for future Prop 1 Fund donations and reference this MOU as the basis for compliance and approval.



#### **Recommendation:**

Approve the **\$27,480** donation of Prop 1 funds for sign adaptors, asphalt repair, and a concept report for a future trail from Liberty Park to North Fork Park, as described above.

#### **Fiscal Impact:**

Weber County allocated \$200,000 of the 2021 Prop 1 fund budget for pathway maintenance. This request will leave the remaining balance at **\$172,520**.

#### Commissioners-

Trails Foundation of Northern Utah would like to purchase 4 sets of flashing solar signs for trail crossings. There are several trail crossings within Weber county that require pedestrians to cross busy roads with no way to alert motorists. UDOT and Weber County Roads have agreed to install the signs if TFNU provides them. The signs will only be active when the button is pressed. These signs are badly needed and will help prevent accidents and allow for safe crossing while using some fantastic trails.

TFNU is requesting \$1,070 to install flashing LED crosswalk lights on 4 locations within Weber County. The signs were previously purchased using Prop 1 funds, but newly instated UDOT sign regulations require special adapters that need to be added to the signs before installation. TFNU is working closely with UDOT to ensure the proper installation.

Trails Foundation of Northern Utah feels this would be an excellent use of Prop 1 funding a very much welcome from trail users in these dangerous areas.

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#### Commissioners-

Trails Foundation of Northern Utah (TFNU) has worked on building and developing the Pineview Loop Pathway (PLP) for over 10 years. The Pineview Loop Pathway is now showing the effects of age and use. Some areas needing repair are becoming safety hazards for thousands of users that bike and walk on this trail annually. The PLP is the backbone of the Ogden Valley trail system and needs to be kept in the best conditions to serve not only the residents but the many tourists that visit the area.

TFNU would like to seal the asphalt on 5 miles of the Pineview Loop Pathway. The asphalt has not been treated since installation and is starting to show signs of drying out and deteriorating. By treating the asphalt with a high-density emulsion-based polymer treatment, it reduces future maintenance and allows the pathway to last many more years.

To complete this project, we are asking for \$22,330 of Prop 1 funds out of the \$47,927 total cost to complete the repair work. A breakdown of costs will be submitted with this letter as well as a few photos.

Trails Foundation of Northern Utah feels this would be an excellent use of the Prop 1 funds awarded and help keep the PLP safe. This would help us with the continuing repairs on the loop.

The Pineview Loop Pathways (PLP) is an asphalt pathway that is currently 7 miles long and connects Huntsville to Eden. The Ogden Valley Master Plan envisions a pathway connecting all the communities in Ogden Valley and providing safe non-motorized alternatives to visitors and residents.

Trails Foundation of Northern Utah would like to hire PEC to provide basic engineering and cost estimates on a new section from Liberty Park to the North entrance of North Fork Park. It is important to understand the complete scope of the pathway to the northern terminus before we proceed with any work from Snowcrest Junior high to Liberty Park on future extensions. If complete this would make it possible to travel from Huntsville to North Fork Park without using any roadway.

Dear Alan;

Project Engineering Consultants, Ltd. (PEC) is pleased to submit a scope and fee to prepare a an extension of the Concept Report for a new trail in Eden, Utah that extends from 4100 North (Liberty Park) to the North Fork Turnoff and then extend to the North Gate Road, approximately 2.5 miles. The new trail concept will have two alternatives evaluated to determine best alignment for a proposed trail.

#### SCOPE OF WORK

- d. Gaps/Overlaps and/or Boundary Resolutions
- e. Dry Utility Design
- f. Off-site improvements including Drainage, Roadway, Grading, Utilities, etc.
- g. Traffic Impact Study (TIS) and Report
- h. Geotechnical Study
- i. Structural Engineering
- j. Extraordinary Requirements Placed on the Project by Governing Agencies
- k. Construction Staking
- I. Construction Administration/ Construction Management (CA/CM), Material Testing, and Special Inspections



# MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN WEBER PATHWAYS AND WEBER COUNTY

- 1. BACKGROUND: Weber County receives sales tax funds collected under Section 59-12-2219 of the Utah Code, which is known as the "county option sales and use tax for highways and public transit." The funds are sometimes referred to as "Prop 1 funds," because the ballot proposition that resulted in the enactment of the tax in Weber County was known as Proposition 1. Therefore, this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) will use the term "Prop 1 funds" to describe the funds. The County is authorized to use Prop 1 funds for specific transportation-related purposes described in state law, including "the development, construction, maintenance, or operation of" certain thoroughfares and trails. Weber Pathways has asked to use Prop 1 funds for specific trail projects and desires to have future access to the funds for other trail projects.
- PURPOSE: The purpose of this MOU is to guarantee that Weber Pathways, dba Trails Foundation of Northern Utah (TFNU), will use Prop 1 funds in accordance with applicable County and State laws, ordinances, and policies, without requiring a separate contract for each donation of funds. The County Commission finds that these donations will contribute to the safety, health, comfort, and convenience of county residents.
- 3. **SCOPE:** This MOU for the donation and use of Prop 1 funds is made between Weber Pathways and Weber County.
- 4. UNDERSTANDING, AGREEMENTS, AND SUPPORT REQUIREMENTS:
  - A. Weber Pathways is a nonprofit 501(c)(3) organization with a mission to "plan, promote, construct, and protect a network of public pathways, trails, and related open spaces for non-motorized users throughout the greater Weber County area."
  - B. Weber County intends to donate Prop 1 funds to Weber Pathways for the purpose of planning and building eligible pathways and trails in unincorporated Weber County.
  - C. To receive donations of Prop 1 funds, Weber Pathways must apply to the County, specifying which projects the Prop 1 funds will be used for. If Weber Pathways wants to use donated Prop 1 funds for projects not included in the original application, it must file a new application seeking authorization to use the funds for other projects.
  - D. Weber Pathways will only use Weber County's Prop 1 fund donations for corridor preservation, engineering, environmental review, surveying, permitting, construction, project management, and any other project-specific tasks necessary to complete approved projects.
  - E. Weber Pathways will comply with all applicable County and State laws, ordinances, and policies.
  - F. Weber Pathways will account for the expenditure of Prop 1 funds and will provide updates to Weber County upon request.

- G. Weber Pathways will indemnify and hold harmless the County, its officers, agents, and employees from and against any claims or suits that arise as a result of Prop 1 fund donations, including improper use of Prop 1 funds.
- 5. **EFFECTIVE DATE:** This MOU is effective upon signature by both parties and will remain in effect until modified, replaced, or terminated by agreement of the parties.
- 6. **MODIFICATION:** Modification of this agreement requires written notification and approval by both parties 30 days in advance.
- 7. **GOVERNING LAW**: The laws of the State of Utah shall govern the validity, construction, enforcement, and interpretation of this agreement.
- 8. **ENTIRE AGREEMENT**: This agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties hereto with respect to the subject matter hereof, and no other statement, whether written or oral, shall be deemed a part of this agreement unless specifically incorporated herein by reference.
- 9. **SIGNATURES:** In witness whereof the undersigned have affixed their respective signatures hereto on the dates indicated below.
