

2026 LGT WORLD MEN'S CURLING CHAMPIONSHIP AGREEMENT

This agreement (the "Agreement") is entered into as of March ____, 2026 by and between Weber County (the "County"), the owner and operator of Weber County Ice Sheet at the Weber County Sports Complex ("Venue"), Ogden City ("Host City"), and Utah Athletic Foundation, d.b.a. Utah Olympic Legacy Foundation ("UOLF"), (collectively "Parties") with respect to 2026 LGT World Men's Curling Championship, a property owned by the World Curling Federation ("WCF") on March 27 to April 4, 2026 and all associated activities as set forth herein (all such associated activities, including all meetings, press events, practice sessions, awards ceremonies, live musical performances, fan activities and expositions, the "Associated Activities", and such event together with the Associated Activities and in each case all aspects thereof, collectively, the "Event"). For good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties hereby agree as follows:

1. Venue Use and Operations.

a. Venue Use. County shall secure the use of the Venue for the purposes of conducting the Event. The exclusive use period for the Event will begin on March 20 and will end on April 4, 2026. The schedule for the Event is attached as Exhibit A.

- i. The Venue has been inspected and confirmed by UOLF to meet World Curling Federation standards for hosting the Event. It will be provided by the County in its current condition ("as is"). Other than the planned and budgeted renovations to the Venue, there are no additional modifications, upgrades, or warranties beyond those required to meet these standards. Any incremental costs for temporary installations necessary for the Event will be treated as Event Costs, with details on scope and allocation defined in later sections of this Agreement.
- ii. County, in consultation with WCF and UOLF, has identified existing areas within the Venue to be used for those administrative and other Event support or "Off-ice Facilities" purposes agreed upon by the Parties (e.g., Team Changing Facilities, WCF Office, Media and Broadcast offices, Medical and Doping Control and Lounge areas for Players, Event Personnel, Technical Officials, Broadcast Personnel and VIP's).
- iii. The County shall provide the necessary outdoor space to accommodate broadcast production compounds, spectator entry, and spectator entertainment associated with the Event. If additional space is deemed necessary to meet the operational requirements of the Event, the County agrees to secure such additional space at no extra rental cost to the Parties.

b. General Venue Operations. County shall be responsible for operating, servicing, and staffing the Venue in a manner normal and customary for the Venue. For example, providing volunteer and paid staff for the provision of ice production, custodial and cleaning services (both prior to and after the Event), ticket collectors, concession and merchandise services control, and operating videoboard(s), public announcement systems in connection with the Event.

c. Venue Rental Fee: The Venue will be provided to by the County for the Event without a venue rental fee. However, County has calculated the business-as-usual impact of the Event at Thirty-Seven Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$37,500) and has been incorporated into the Event Budget as an Event Cost and shall be managed by the terms outlined in section 3 of this agreement.

2. Event Organization.

- a. Local Organizing Committee. The Parties will develop a Local Organizing Committee (“LOC”) for the Event. In connection with the formation and operation of the LOC, the Host City and the County have delegated certain responsibilities and duties to Visit Ogden (“Visit Ogden”) for the limited purpose of supporting event planning, coordination, and delivery, as further defined in this Agreement. Any such delegation shall not relieve the Host City or the County, as applicable, of ultimate responsibility for performance under this Agreement, and the delegating party shall remain fully responsible for the acts and omissions of Visit Ogden in connection with such delegated responsibilities. A representative from UOLF, County and Visit Ogden, as the Host City designee, will co-chair the LOC and shall be responsible for the preparation and delivery of the Event. The Parties will mutually agree to the detailed responsibilities and delivery timelines in the LOC according to the general responsibilities outlined below and in accordance with the obligations defined in the WCF Event Agreement which has been signed by the Parties. The LOC responsibility matrix for the event is attached as Exhibit B
- b. Conduct of Competition. The LOC will abide by the WCF Hosting Agreement which has been signed by the Parties and the WCF general and special regulations (WCF Rules). The Parties shall be mutually responsible for conducting the Events relating to the competition activities (i.e., all activities “inside the field of play”) and doing so in accordance with WCF Rules. Such roles and responsibilities shall be expressly defined by the Event LOC.
- c. Event Personnel. The LOC intends to utilize certain exempt and non-exempt employees of the County, Host City, Visit Ogden and UOLF for Event-related roles. The LOC will coordinate with the County, Host City, Visit Ogden and UOLF to define the specific responsibilities of these full-time and part-time staff. All such employees shall always remain employees of their respective organizations. Compensation for these personnel will be the responsibility of their respective employers and shall not be considered an Event Cost.

3. Event Revenue and Expenses.

- a. All revenues generated by either party for the Event shall be referred to as “Event Revenue”, with the exception of concessions F&B referred to below under F&B section 6.a, and any and all costs and expenses attributable to the Event that are incurred by either party shall be referred to as “Event Costs”, in each case unless otherwise expressly set forth herein or otherwise mutually agreed upon by the parties. The Parties will organize the events from an overall philosophy of all Event Revenue, and all Event Costs shall be shared equally by the parties on a One-Third, One Third, One Third basis with the goal of delivering a minimum break-even budget for the Parties. To manage the specific requirements of the Event the Parties shall complete a budget for each Event no less than eight (8) months prior to the first day of competition and shall be attached as Exhibit B to this agreement to define shared costs and income and forecast event profit or loss. The Parties agree that any significant increases with respect to any Event Costs after the date hereof, in either case for any reason other than due to a Force Majeure Event (defined below), shall be subject to the mutual agreement of the Parties via the LOC co-chairs. Within sixty (60) days following the Event, the parties shall reconcile all Event Revenue and Event Costs to determine the appropriate settlement payment to be made such that the total Event profits or losses shall be shared equally by County, Host City and UOLF. An event budget is attached as Exhibit C

- b. Accounting Services. UOLF shall be responsible for all accounting service for the Events including accounts receivable and payable.
- c. WCF Financial Contribution. WCF will make a financial contribution of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000) related to Event sponsorship and broadcast rights and will be considered Event Revenue and is defined in the WCF Event agreement. The UOLF shall be responsible for ensuring that WCF Rules related to the fulfillment of obligations are obtained and provided to County and Host City. The Parties shall equally share any reduction of WCF financial contribution in the case that requirements were not met for an Event, except in the case that a specific function or responsibility does not comply with the written obligations assumed by each Party, as defined by the LOC responsibility matrix defined in Exhibit B.
- d. Local Sponsorship Rights. As allowed by WCF Rules, Parties shall share equally the right to sell camera-visible signage, non-competition signage and exhibit rights for the Event. The Parties shall mutually agree upon the best use of inventory to maximize Event Revenue. Sponsorship Packages are defined in Exhibit C. The general philosophy governing the sales of limited, camera visible signage shall be “first past the post,” meaning that priority will be granted to the Party that secures a sale first. All revenue generated from the sale of camera-visible signage, non-competition signage and exhibit rights shall be classified as Event Revenue. UOLF and Host City shall coordinate on all sponsor categories and target groups, Sponsorship assets included within packages (e.g., signage locations, amount and concentration of partner advertising, number of announcements and videoboard spots,) shall be mutually agreed upon no less than one (1) Month prior to the first day of competition.
- e. Funding and Grants. The Parties will work cooperatively to maximize funding from regional and state entities and shall be treated as Event Revenue. At the time of the execution of this agreement, One Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000) have been secured from the Utah Sports Commission and shall be Event Revenue.

4. Ticket Sales, VIP Hospitality and Operations.

a. Ticket Sales and Operations. As between the parties, County shall be responsible for, and shall control all the administrative aspects of, ticketing sales operations for the Event, including the right to determine the manner and method for Event ticket sales. County shall determine, in consultation with Host City and UOLF, (1) ticket pricing, (2) number of tickets available for sale, (3) on-sale dates, (4) ticket fees and/or surcharges, (5) the number of tickets available for charitable purposes, (6) the number of complimentary tickets available for use by each party and/or their respective designees and (7) all policies relating to the use of Event tickets such as refund policies and general disclaimers.

b. In Venue VIP Hospitality. County shall provide VIP hospitality in the Venue. In conjunction with UOLF and Host Venue, Parties will establish food and beverage service plan for the event which shall include food service including hot and cold food and alcoholic and non-alcoholic beverages in a mutually agreed location for each Event. VIP hospitality area will operate on each day of competition for the Event at mutually agreed upon timing.

c. Premium Package and VIP Hospitality sales. UOLF shall be responsible for, in consultation with County and Visit Ogden, premium package and VIP hospitality pricing, number of tickets available for sale, on-sale dates, the number of tickets available for charitable purposes, and all policies relating to the use of Event tickets such as refund policies and general disclaimers. Sponsorship and Premium Ticket Package is outlined in Exhibit D.

d. Complimentary Venue Access. County, Host City, Visit Ogden, and UOLF shall each have the right to up to Fifty (50) VIP passes for their respective dignitaries the duration of the Event. A VIP pass shall provide access to one (1) ticketed session. The Parties shall coordinate on number or invited guests and the session of attendance to manage VIP capacity. Additional passes for VIP, and Hospitality shall be purchased at an agreed upon price based on the cost of food and beverage service. UOLF shall be responsible for managing the response list and capacity of the VIP space and seating on behalf of the Parties and shall provide preliminary numbers one (1) month prior to the Event and confirm the total number of VIP, and Hospitality numbers no less than seven (7) days prior to the first day of competition.

5. Event Promotion; Public Announcements.

a. Event Promotion. The calendar of advertising and promotion shall be the responsibility of UOLF, and such responsibilities shall be carried out in consultation with County, Visit Ogden, and Host City.

b. Public Relations. The calendar of public announcements, including content, timing and other details relating to the Event shall be the responsibility of UOLF in consultation with County, Visit Ogden, and Host City. In addition, the Parties shall mutually agree upon general talking points for media inquiries responding to such press release.

6. Food and Beverage Services; Merchandise.

a. Food and Beverage Services. The Venue is responsible for designating designated food and nonalcoholic beverage concessionaire, shall have the exclusive right to sell food and beverages at the Event, and offer its existing product offerings.

b. Merchandise. If the Parties collectively determine to create and offer for sale merchandise and/or novelty items specific to or relating to the Event (“Event Merchandise”), such as merchandise or items bearing the Event Logo, for sale in and around the Venue during the Event, any proceeds of Event Merchandise sales shall be Event Revenue.

c. Beer Service and Sales. The County shall be responsible for authorizing, coordinating, and overseeing the service and sale of beer at the Event, including compliance with all applicable laws, regulations, licensing, and permitting requirements. Beer may be sold only by approved vendors and in designated areas of the Venue. Proceeds derived from beer sales at the Event shall be Event Revenue.

7. Host City Services: Visit Ogden, in coordination with the Host City, shall provide, at no cost to the Parties, the following services in support of the Event:

- a. Public Safety: Coordination and deployment of police, fire, and emergency services for the Event.
- b. Community Outreach: Engagement with area schools and non-profit organizations to promote awareness and support for the Event.
- c. Public Transportation: Liaison with public transportation services for the Event.
- d. City Celebrations: Organization and execution of city-sponsored celebrations and activities associated with the Event.
- e. Venue Entertainment and Community Activities. Host City shall be responsible for determining the viability of including live entertainment or community activations at the

- Venue during the Event. Infrastructure, entertainment, necessary staging and production shall be arranged for and procured by Host City with the support of UOLF and shall be considered Event Cost.
- f. City Decorations and Signage: Coordination for the installation of city decorations and Event-related signage in designated public areas.
 - g. City Approvals. Obtaining any permissions required from the applicable City and County regulatory authorities to hold the Event.
8. Representations; Warranties; Covenants. Each party hereto represents and warrants to the other party that it has the full power and authority to enter into this Agreement and to engage in the transactions contemplated hereby, and that this Agreement is a valid obligation of such party and binding upon such party in accordance with the terms hereof. Each party shall obey and comply with all applicable present and future laws, ordinances, rules and regulations.
9. Indemnification and Insurance.
- a. UOLF's Indemnity. The UOLF shall jointly and severally indemnify, save, and hold harmless the County and Host City and their directors, officers, agents, shareholders, and employees from and against any and all costs, losses, liabilities, damages, lawsuits, claims, and expenses arising out of third party claims, including, without limitation, court costs, reasonable attorneys' fees and disbursements, and all amounts paid in investigation, defense, or settlement of any of the foregoing, incurred in connection with or arising out of or resulting from (a) a material breach of any of the UOLF's obligations under this Agreement, (b) any act, omission, negligence, fault, or violation of law or ordinance by the UOLF, or its trustees, officers, employees, or agents, other than actions which it or they are entitled to take under this Agreement, or (c) the enforcement of this indemnification obligation. The UOLF's indemnification obligations under this paragraph 9 (a) shall survive the termination of this Agreement.
 - b. The County's Indemnity. The County does not agree to indemnify any other party to this Agreement. Any party to this Agreement who is aggrieved because of the acts, omissions, or negligence of the County may submit a claim against the County in accordance with Utah Code Ann. § § 17-60-401 and 63G-7-401.
 - c. County is a body corporate and politic of the State of Utah, subject to the Governmental Immunity Act of Utah (the "Act"), Utah Code Ann. §§ 63G-7-101 to -904. The Parties agree that the County shall only be liable within the parameters of the Governmental Immunity Act. Nothing contained in this Agreement shall be construed in any way, to modify the limits of liability set forth in that Act or the basis for liability as established in the Act.
 - d. Host City Indemnity. The Host City does not agree to indemnify any other party to this Agreement. Any party to this Agreement who is aggrieved because of the acts, omissions, or negligence of the Host City may submit a claim against the Host City in accordance with Utah Code Ann. § 63G-7-401.
 - e. Host City is a body corporate and politic of the State of Utah, subject to the Governmental Immunity Act of Utah (the "Act"), Utah Code Ann. §§ 63G-7-101 to -904. The Parties agree that the Host City shall only be liable within the parameters of the Governmental Immunity

Act. Nothing contained in this Agreement shall be construed in any way, to modify the limits of liability set forth in that Act or the basis for liability as established in the Act.

- f. Insurance. UOLF shall obtain and maintain in force throughout the Use Period the following insurance:
- i. Maintain Commercial General Liability Insurance with limits of not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence and \$2,000,000 general aggregate (on a per-location basis). Such coverage shall be primary and shall not exclude Participants or Spectators where applicable.
 - ii. Maintain Automobile Liability Insurance with a minimum single limit of \$1,000,000 for bodily injury and property damage, including sudden and accidental pollution liability, applicable to vehicles owned, hired, or non-owned and used in connection with activities under this Agreement.
 - iii. Maintain Workers' Compensation Insurance as required by law (Utah Law, 35-I-46). All policies shall include a waiver of subrogation in favor of the other Parties, their affiliates, officers, directors, agents, employees, and insurers, as required by law., including provisions that insurers waive any right of recovery or subrogation against the other Parties, their affiliates, officers, directors, agents, employees, and insurers.
 - iv. County is a participant in the Utah Counties Indemnity Pool ("UCIP"). Any changes in County's insurance through UCIP will take precedence for purposes of County's insurance requirements and County's insurance limits may change or become greater than or less than the limits provided under this Agreement
 - v. All independent contractors engaged in connection with the Event shall, at their own expense, maintain commercial general liability insurance in accordance with Utah law and customary industry standards, sufficient to cover their activities related to the Event. Upon request, contractors shall provide certificates of insurance evidencing such coverage prior to performing any services.
10. Force Majeure. A Force Majeure event is defined to be an event beyond either party's reasonable control and occurring without its fault or negligence. If the Event or portions thereof is cancelled or interrupted, and/or the performance of either party hereto under the terms of this Agreement is made impossible because of a Force Majeure Event, such cancellation, interruption and/or failure to perform shall not be considered a breach of this Agreement. Upon the cancellation of the Event or upon the conclusion of any postponed and rescheduled portions thereof for reasons described in this Section, all Event Costs that are not able to be recouped or mitigated, and any Event Revenue that may be retained by the parties despite such Event cancellation or interruption, shall be shared equally by the parties and reconciled in accordance with the terms of Section 3 above as if the Event had been held as scheduled. The decision to cancel the Event or any portions thereof due to any Force Majeure Event shall be determined by WCF in accordance with WCF Rules.
11. Termination. No Party may terminate this Agreement except as expressly provided herein. A Party may terminate immediately upon written notice if the other Party breaches a material term and fails to cure within ten (10) business days after notice, or within a longer period approved in writing by the non-breaching Party if commercially reasonable steps to cure are underway. Upon termination by County, Host City and UOLF shall jointly pay all non-recoverable Event Costs incurred as of the termination date. Upon termination by Host City, County and UOLF shall share this responsibility. Upon termination by UOLF, County and Host City shall share this responsibility. In addition and regardless of any provision contrary contained herein, County may seek other legal or equitable remedies, including claims for lost income from foregoing alternate Venue uses. The Parties mutually waive any

claims for consequential, incidental, or indirect damages, including lost business opportunities, reputational harm, or punitive damages, arising from termination.

12. Miscellaneous.

- a. Relationship of Parties. This Agreement does not create a partnership, joint venture, agency relationship, or association; nor does this Agreement, or the operations hereunder, create the relationship of bailor and bailee. Nothing contained in this Agreement or in any agreement made pursuant hereto shall ever be construed to create a partnership, joint venture, agency relationship, or association, or the relationship of bailor and bailee, or to impose any duty, obligation or liability that would arise therefrom with respect to either or both of the parties hereto.
- b. Governing Law. The parties hereby acknowledge that in entering into this Agreement they have contracted with reference to the laws of the State of Utah, and the terms and provisions of this Agreement shall be interpreted and construed under the laws of the State of Utah, except in such cases and to such extent as the laws of another jurisdiction shall necessarily control.
- c. No Assignment of Agreement. Neither this Agreement nor any of the obligations hereunder may be assigned by the one of the Parties without the prior written consent of the remaining two Parties.
- d. Binding Effect. This Agreement shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective legal representatives, successors and assigns.
- e. No Third Party Beneficiaries. Any agreement to pay an amount and any assumption of liability herein contained, expressed or implied, shall be only for the benefit of each party hereto and their respective legal representatives successors and assigns, and such agreements or assumption shall not inure to the benefit of the obligees of any indebtedness or any other party, whomsoever, it being the intention of the parties hereto that no person or entity shall be deemed a third party beneficiary of this Agreement.
- f. Amendment. This Agreement may be amended from time to time by written instrument signed by both of the parties hereto.
- g. No Waiver. No consent or waiver, expressed or implied, by either party hereto to or of any breach or default by the other party hereto in the performance by the other party of its prospective obligations hereunder shall be deemed or construed to be a consent or waiver to or of any other breach or default in the performance by the other party hereto of the same or any other obligations of such other party hereunder or its rights with respect to such default. Failure on the part of either party hereto to complain of any act or failure to act of the other party or to declare the other party in default, irrespective of how long such failure continues, shall not constitute a waiver by such party of its rights hereunder.

WHEREFORE, the parties to this Agreement do hereby execute this Agreement effective as of the day and year first above written.

- World Curling rules apply, unless otherwise indicated below or explained at the Team Meeting.
- Play-off System: The teams ranked 1st and 2nd get a bye to the semi-finals. The teams ranked 3rd to 6th play in qualification games (3 v 6 and 4 v 5). The winners of those qualification games advance to the semi-finals. The 1st ranked team will play against the winner of the 4 v 5 game and the 2nd ranked team will play against the winner of the 3 v 6 game. The winners of the semi-finals play in the gold medal game, the losers of the semi-final play in the bronze medal game.
- All games will be ten (10) ends, with extra end(s) to break tied games.
- First named teams in each draw play the stones with the dark-coloured handles, and wear dark coloured upper playing garments. Second named teams in each draw play the stones with the light-coloured handles, and wear light coloured upper playing garments.
- There will be a nine (9) minute practice for each team before each round robin game. The practice starts 35 minutes before the scheduled game time. The team with the first practice during the round robin will be the team with dark stones.
- The last stone advantage in the first end of the round robin games will be decided by playing LSD stones as per World Curling rules.
- The ice for all post-round robin games has been pre-determined as shown in the official draw.
