G. ACTION ITEMS:

1. **APPROVAL OF THE FINAL READING OF ORDINANCE 2026-16 OF THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF WEBER COUNTY AMENDING THE AGRICULTURE PROTECTION AREA FEE IN WEBER COUNTY CODE SECTION 16-2-2.**

Craig Brandt (Clerk/Auditor's Office): This is the Final Reading for a proposed fee ordinance change. Existing Agriculture Protection Area (APA) application fees are proposed to be updated to \$300 for the first five parcels and \$25 for each additional parcel.

Commissioner Harvey moved to approve the Final Reading of Ordinance 2026-16 of the County Commissioners of Weber County amending the Agriculture Protection Area fee in Weber County Code Section 16-2-2; Commissioner Bolos seconded.

3. **APPROVAL OF A CONTRACT WITH ACTION TARGET INC. FOR A 10-VISIT MAINTENANCE PLAN FOR THE WEBER COUNTY SPORTS SHOOTING COMPLEX.**

Brad Cragun (Parks and Recreation Director): This contract with Action Targets is for the cleaning of lead from the trap room at the Weber County Shooting Complex. Ten cleanings are provided under this one year contract. This cleaning maintains the safety of the range, our patrons, and employees. Each year we revisit

this contract and go to each of the limited companies that can perform this specialized cleaning to determine who can best provide this service. After our evaluation we decided to continue with Action Target for this service occurring every six weeks for the next year.

Commissioner Harvey: This is a great asset that we enjoy as well as other counties who use it. Thank you for making sure we remain in compliance.

Commissioner Harvey moved to approve a contract with Action Target Inc. for a 10-visit maintenance plan for the Weber County Sports Shooting Complex; Commissioner Bolos seconded.
