RESOLUTION 39-2007

A RESOLUTION PLACING ON THE NOVEMBER 6th, 2007 BALLOT THE OPINION QUESTION OF WHETHER WEBER COUNTY MAY BE AUTHORIZED TO IMPOSE A QUARTER PERCENT (.25 %) SALES AND USE TAX FOR CORRIDOR PRESERVATION, CONGESTION MITIGATION, OR TO EXPAND CAPACITY FOR REGIONALLY SIGNIFICANT TRANSPORTATION FACILITIES

WHEREAS, § 59-12-1703 *Utah Code Ann.*, provides in part states that "Beginning on or after April 1, 2007 and subject to other provisions to this part, a county legislative body may impose a sales and use tax of up to one quarter percent (.25 %);" and

WHEREAS, § 59-12-1703, *Utah Code Ann.*, further provides that before imposing a tax, the County Commission shall "submit an opinion question to the county's registered voters voting on the imposition of the tax so that each registered voter has the opportunity to express the registered voter's opinion on whether a tax should be imposed;" and

WHEREAS, the needs for corridor preservation, congestion mitigation or the need to expand capacity for regionally significant transportation facilities continues to be significant in Weber County; and

WHEREAS, various groups within Weber County including but not limited to the Chamber of Commerce, the Weber Area Council of Governments and others, have urged the Weber County Commission to place the opinion question on the November 6th, 2007 ballot;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Weber County, as follows:

- 1. Pursuant to § 59-12-1703, *Utah Code Ann*. the Board of County Commissioners of Weber County directs that an opinion question relating to the imposition of a one quarter percent (.25%) sales and use tax for corridor preservation, congestion mitigation or to expand capacity for regionally significant transportation facilities be placed on the ballot at the next municipal general election which will be on Tuesday, November 6th, 2007.
 - 2. The specific question to be placed before the voters is as follows:
