

Adult Softball guidelines as of 05/15/20:

Follow “Social Distancing Recommendations”. Signs are posted throughout the park as a reminder. This includes but is not limited to the 6-foot distancing recommendation. NO contact (high fives, shaking hands, hugs, etc.) while on the premises.

Exhibit caution when engaging in close contact team sports.

Teams are limited to 12 players per night.

Teams are limited to 13 spectators per team. Please encourage your teammates to follow this rule. We realize you have families/friends that would like to come and watch you play but there is a strict guideline we must follow of no more 50 people per field at this time. That is 25 people per team, including players. Spectators maintain social distancing between household groups and wear face coverings when social distancing guidelines are difficult to maintain.

Avoid contact with high-touch surfaces, including fence tops near fields and dug out areas. Restrooms and high-touch traffic areas will be on an hourly sanitation schedule.

Do not congregate in any outdoor space. Limit cross traffic and loitering between fields and players before/after games. Please do not congregate and socialize before and after games. We expect teams to show up to the fields with enough time to warm up and quickly collect your things and exit the park after your game. No loitering or congregating (including in the parking lot).

Participants should have their symptoms checked prior to each competition or practice. (This is up to team captains to ask questions of your team and make sure any player or spectator that isn't feeling well or has a fever, or may have been in contact with those symptoms to please stay home).

Facemasks, though not required, are highly encouraged for players and spectators. You will need to provide your own masks. County employees that cannot socially distance will be provided a facemask to wear when they can't practice 6 feet of social distancing.

No tag outs may be done with a hand. You may tag out with a ball or mitt but at no time shall you touch another player with your hand(s).

Teams are encouraged to bring sanitation wipes to wipe down bats between batters if bats are shared or to provide your own bat.

When your team is at bat, please don't congregate in your teams dug out. We encourage teams to stay behind the dug outs on the grass (not in the field of play) and distance yourself from other players.

If you are playing on fields 1 or 4, we encourage players to enter and exit through the east gate. If you are playing on field 2 or 3, please enter and exit through the north gate. There are parking lots near both entrances. This will help with cross traffic and reduce the amount of people at one entrance/exit.

The scorekeeper tower will be for employees only at this time. Please give your signed release forms and line ups to the night supervisor. The night supervisor will turn your papers in to the scorekeepers. These need to be turned in to him no later than 10 minutes prior to game time. If a player needs to sign your release form to be eligible to play, he can get your release form for you. Each player still needs to sign the release form to be legal.
